On November 1, we celebrated our first anniversary as the unified YMCA of Southwestern Ontario. We expanded our Children's Educational Services with a new Child Care centre in Lucan and expanded infant and toddler programs at the Y Learning and Career Centre in Sarnia. Our YMCA Newcomer Services led the innovative WE Value Partnership in Windsor in collaboration with more than 50 local partners, to streamline the intake process and support successful newcomer settlement. Our Health and Fitness Team launched our YThrive program across Canada via MGI, bringing accessible wellness programming to new communities nation-wide.



Dana's Y Story

We are a busy family, and my husband, Tony and I have four children - Lilly, Sophie, Kris, and Nathalie – all with special needs.

Lilly started going to Camp Queen Elizabeth when she was 8. We were nervous sending her to an overnight camp at such a young age, but when she came home, we knew we had made the right choice. We had found



the right camp for ALL OUR KIDS!

The kids enjoy the outdoors and one of our biggest challenges is finding the right programs to support their individual needs. YMCA Camp Queen Elizabeth is a very special place and it has become an annual summer tradition to send our kids there.

The amazing staff go out of their way to make our kids feel welcome, and also push them to try new things.

The Y gives the kids an amazing place to go every summer. Each year we see them grow and learn new things from camp. They come home with stories of their amazing adventures, talk about it all year long. They get SO excited when we tell them they get to return next summer!

Chris' Y Story

My name is Chris, I recently turned 50, and have been married to my wife for 18 years with three grown children. Last year, I was having a lot of problems with depression, anxiety, and massive panic attacks. I decided enough was enough, so I quit drinking and gave up a hard drug habit that had been slowly destroying my mind after many

years of abuse. At the end of the year, I asked my doctor if I would be healthy enough to begin a workout routine and she said "absolutely." So I got a 7-day pass for the Central Huron YMCA.

January 4, 2019 was the first day I walked into the Y and my life has forever changed for the good! I am now clean and sober, working out 5 to

6 days a week. I took a running class and ran my first ever 5k race and the Y helped me with training programs and support. I've dealt with a lot of mental health challenges, but I am determined. I have never had more confidence and strength. I feel great!
